Background:

- ◆ Public Participation Plan must be periodically reviewed and updated

Tribal Sovereignty: the Basis for Tribal Consultation

Indian tribes have the right to

- ◆ Self-governance
- ◆ Self-determination
- ◆ Economic Self-sufficiency

What is Tribal Consultation?

Tribal consultation is the federally mandated process for timely and meaningful notification, consideration and discussion with tribes on actions proposed by Federal, State and local governments that may impact tribal lands and property

Tribal Consultation

3 principles of tribal consultation:

- ◆ Communication
- ◆ Coordination
- ◆ Cooperation

RTC's Public Participation Plan Update

Process and Timeline:

- ◆ Seek RTC Board and RTAC comments at outset
- ◆ Review draft PPP update with RTAC and Board
- ◆ Consult with planning partners
- ◆ 45-day public comment period
- ◆ Publicity, media release and legal notice
- ◆ Seek approval of PPP update (summer 2016)
