This project creates a continuous, uninterrupted bike-pedestrian trail along the Columbia River waterfront in Stevenson. It includes an overlook of a new waterfront park, picnic tables, benches, interpretive signs, and native plant landscaping.

- The project provides an aesthetic and safe bike-pedestrian connection between Stevenson's waterfront and downtown corridor for the community and the community's visitors.
- Completes the connection to citywide interpretive trails including the U.S. National Park Service's Lewis & Clark National Historic Trail and the Ice Age Floods National Geographic Trail.
